Ise-Shima National Park (Japan's 13th designated national park)

Ise-Shima National Park is Japan's 13th national park: in November 1946, it was officially designated by the Japanese government as a national park for the first time after the Second World War. This national park has a length of about 50 kilometers (east to west) and a width of about 40 kilometers (south to north), and covers large areas of three cities and one town (with a population of 100,000 people in total) including the forests of Ise Grand Shrine.

Almost the entire area of Shima City, where all of our four hotels are located, is part of the national park. This area has been called "Miketsu-kuni" (a province to supply food to the deities enshrined at Ise Grand Shrine) since ancient times, and people here have a long history of living in harmony with nature.



### What is a National Park?

According to Article 2 of Japan's Natural Parks Act, a national park is defined as an "outstanding scenic area that deserves to represent Japanese landscapes."



### Spring and Summer

Brown-eared bulbul, white-cheeked starling, meadow bunting, Japanese bush warbler, Japanese white-eye, black kite, Japanese pygmy woodpecker, Japanese tit, Oriental greenfinch, grey-headed lapwing, varied tit, Eurasian tree sparrow, Chinese bamboo partridge, green pheasant, long-tailed tit, blue rock thrush, Japanese wagtail, Oriental turtle dove, black-tailed gull, grey heron, great egret, zitting cisticola, little grebe, great cormorant, common kingfisher, little egret, spot-billed duck, Japanese cormorant and jungle crow



### Autumn and Winter

Eurasian bullfinch, black-faced bunting, red-flanked bluetail, rustic bunting, pale thrush, Japanese pied wagtail, grey wagtail, Daurian redstart, dusky thrush, great crested grebe, black-necked grebe, osprey, Eurasian coot, hawfinch, eastern marsh harrier, mallard, northern shoveler, Eurasian teal, falcated duck, gadwall, northern pintail, Eurasian wigeon, tufted duck, common sandpiper, long-tailed rosefinch, common kestrel and Eurasian sparrowhawk

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
